But Barber won't be afraid to bring in freshman relief pitcher Margie Kue-ber.

"She doesn't mind the pressure, but if she walks a couple it bothers her," said Barber. "When she comes in to pitch she doesn't worry about the run-ners on base.

"If she gets the batters swinging she's fine," adds Barber on her young reliefer. "She's usually pretty good at getting the ball over the plate, and she has the fastest pitch on the staff."

"Our first goal is to win the game," adds Barber. "But the kids should enjoy the game and play fairly, I don't like poor sportsmanship."
