

Camp for tots opens

The Farmington Branch of the YMCA will open two camp programs designed to provide exciting away-from-home experiences for tots in varied group situations, centered around crafts, games, songs, stories, creative expression and fun.

New to the area, they are called Kiddie Kamp, and Pre-School Camp.

For children ages 5 and 6, Kiddie Kamp will be offered in Farmington City Park and Novi Methodist Church. Campers will provide their own packed lunch, supplemented with milk furnished by the camp, for the 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. program.

Beginning June 20, Kiddie Kamp will be in session for eight, one-week sessions. Y members will pay \$15 per week; non-members will be charged \$21.

The leadership for Kiddie Kamp will be provided by Barbara Dimanno

and Carol Robie. Mrs. Dimanno is a graduate of Madonna College, and has worked as a nursery school teacher. Mrs. Robie has a master's degree and teaches at St. Benedict Elementary School.

PRE-SCHOOL camp is for both boys and girls, age three and four. The camp will be conducted from 9:30 a.m. to noon at two sites: The Farmington Y, 28100 Farmington Road and the Novi Church, 41671 Ten Mile.

The Y will sponsor a variety of two-, three- or five-day sessions. Fee for the two-day session is \$5 for Y members, and \$8 for non-members.

Leadership for Pre-School Camp comes from Helene Koujian, a graduate of Eastern Michigan University and a kindergarten teacher.

The Farmington Y is taking registrations on a first-come first-served basis. The telephone number is 553-4020.

Plymouth center honors volunteers

Honored for the generous giving of their time to the Plymouth Center for Human Development, were seven men and women were saluted for their efforts at a recent awards banquet.

Plymouth Center for Human Development is an agency of the Michigan Department of Mental Health. It is responsible for providing care and training for more than 800 mentally retarded children and adults.
