 West led the king of clubs.

Cue bidding is an extremely broad subject. Partnership agreement and understanding is essential to use them successfully.

South's red card hand presented a problem. The hand was too powerful to preempt. Fortunately, the two heart call was of the intermediate variety: an opening bid and a six card suit. He was missing the king-queen of hearts, but the length of the suit makes the bid most acceptable.

North cue bid the ace of clubs. This call showed heart values and a good hand. South cue bid the diamond ace and North bid five hearts—an invitation to partner to bid a slam if he had at least second round control of the unbid suit—spades.

Middle ages are heralded

For the ninth straight year, the Ann Arbor Medieval Festival will bring the Middle Ages back to life.

This year's Medieval Festival will begin at 10 a.m. and last until dusk on Aug. 6 and 7 on the lawn of the University of Michigan School of Music, according to Heidi Gottfried of Southfield.

Ms. Gottfried became involved in the festival through friends she knows from the Attie Theatre in Greetown.

"We've been planning this since May and have recruited actors, dancers, jugglers and fools for the festival," she said.

Ms. Gottfried will do a Punch and Judy show in addition to helping on the public relations. She said about 150 people are involved in the planning of the day-long gala which will feature concerts, an art fair and crafts as well as the jugglers, wandering minstrels, an itinerant monk, mimes and fools.

Last year more than 8,000 people from Michigan and out of state were drawn to the festival.
