South's red card hand presented a problem. The hand was too powerful to preempt. Fortunately, the two heart call was of the intermediate variety: an opening bid and a six card suit. He was missing the king-queenen of hearts, but the length of the suit makes the bid most acceptable.

North cue bid the ace of clubs. This call showed heart values and a good hand. South cue bid the diamond ace and North bid five hearts—an invitation to partner to bid a slam if he bid at least second round control of the unbid suit—spades.
