Wingard stood before the bench. A slight man with thinning hair and a trimmed beard, he was dressed in a well-tailored pink three-piece suit. His off-white shirt was open at the neck.

"Is your name Gordon Daniel Wingard?" Judge Feder asked.

prison.

"You're entitled to an attorrey." the judge said. "And you will get a preliminary hearing at which the people must prove the offenses with which you are accused were com-mitted and that there is probable cause to think you committed them.
"Do you have an attorney?"
"No. sir." Wingard answered.
"Do you have any income?" Then.
"Do you have any assets?"

Because of the nature of the crimes, no bail was allowed.

At that time, the burden will be with the people to prove that the crimes Gordon Wingard is charged with were truly committed, and secondly, to show there is probably cause to think he compitted them.

Al a conference supported by the Jewish Community Council. Jewish Labor Committee. Frontlash and So-cial Democrats U.S.A., Tom Turner, resident of the Detroit AFLCIO. Bishop Thomas Gumbleton and Rabbi. Lone Fram called upon Congress to set a minimum howly wage of Sa, which, according to Norman Naimark of the Labor Zionist Alliance, is just above noverty level. above poverty level.

Naimark said the Carter adminis-tration's compromise proposal, set at \$2.65, is legislating poverty for those who work at a minimum wage.
