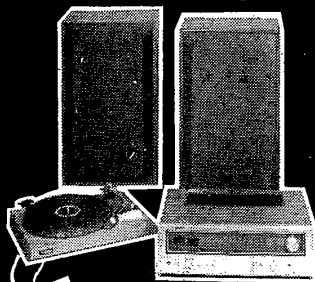

SEMTA board officers elected

Henry M. Hogan, Jr., former co-publisher of the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers, has been elected to a one-year term as second vice-chairman of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

Also elected along with Hogan, who still serves on the board of the Suburban Communication Corporation, were Tom Turner, president of the Metropolitan Detroit AFL-CIO Council and Dwight Havens, president of the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce. Turner was elected to his second term as chairman of the SEMTA board and Havens will serve as the first vice-chairman.

Hogan, a representative of Oakland County, was one of six new members recently appointed to the newly structured SEMTA board. The board was expanded from nine to 15 members April 15. Under the new structure, the board's members represent the seven SEMTA counties and the city of Detroit on a one-person, one-vote basis.

The former publisher became active in the newspaper industry in 1961 when he purchased an interest in the Birmingham Eccentric. That publication, during his tenure as editor and publisher, won more national and state awards than any other weekly in the United States.

In his career he has also served a term in the Michigan House of Representatives and was one of the founders of the Suburban Newspapers of America. In 1974 he served as president of the Michigan Press Association.

Turner and Havens were also elected to one year terms. Turner, prior to

being elected SEMTA board chairman served as first vice-chairman. Havens is an outer-Wayne County representative to the board.
