Congressman William Brodhead re-cently criticized the Department of Health. Education and Welfare's (HEW) handling of Michigan's PBB contamination.

Brodhead, whose district includes Farmington. Southfield and Reford Townshio, said HEW should have done more and acted faster to solve the problems caused by the accidental mixing of the fire retardant chemical with cattle feed. PBB-contaminated cattle have been reported in states as far away as New Jersey.

In testimony before the House Commerce Committee's Investigations Sub-committee. Broadhead called the fed-eral government's response. "highly in-adequate" and a "tragic example of governmental insensitivity."

He said when the PBB "crisis" threatened to poison hundreds of thusands of Michigan residents. HEW's ressonse was to refer the problem to a committee. From months later, when that committee proposed strong recommendations. the denartment failed to implement the most important of them. Brodhead charged.

To control a similar poisoning outbreak in the future, he called for the creation of a special, "chemical emergency response team" to "control and correct chemical contamination incidents quickly."

He also urged the Environmental Protection Agency to make immediate studies to determine if PBB con-tamination is a problem in other parts of the country and asked that agency to establish strict regulations con-trolling use of the chemical.
