Hills meeting agenda

Farmington Hills City Council will meet with the city's Park and Recreation consultant to discuss the master plan at 7 p.m., Monday in the city council chambers at Eleven Mile and Orchard Lake Road.

At 8 p.m., the council will conduct a special meeting. The following items are on the agenda:

- Request to change from a single family zoning (RA-2) to office service use (OS-1) to parking (P-1). The property is located on the northwest corner of Eleven Mile and Orchard Lake Road.
- Request to change the property on the west side of Orchard Lake between Eleven Mile and Hull from single family use (RA-1) to office service use (OS-1).
- Request to rezone the south side

of Thirteen Mile between Northwestern Highway and Middle Belt from single family use (RA-1) to office service use (OS-1).

- Request to rezone the west side of Halsted between Grand River and Eleven Mile from single family (RA-2) to light industrial (LI-1).
- Request to rezone Haggerty and Halsted from Thirteen and a half Mile to Fourteen Mile from single family residential use (RA-1) to planned residential use (PR-2).
- Request to rezone Haggerty near 1275, which includes the southeast corner of Nine Mile and Haggerty, from single family residential (RA-1) to office service (OS-1).
- Consideration of vacating 77 feet on the east side of Scotten, retaining an easement for public utilities in

Meadowbrook Heights subdivision.

- Show cause hearing concerning three properties which have been condemned by the city: 31016 Freedom, 34034 Eight Mile, 34730 Eight Mile.

Harvard graduates 5 from Farmington

Broadhead beefs about PBB bugs

Congressman William Broadhead recently criticized the Department of Health, Education and Welfare's (HEW) handling of Michigan's PBB contamination.

Broadhead, whose district includes Farmington, Southfield and Rieford Township, said HEW should have done more and acted faster to solve the problems caused by the accidental mixing of the fire retardant chemical with cattle feed. PBB-contaminated cattle have been reported in states as far away as New Jersey.

In testimony before the House Commerce Committee's Investigations Subcommittee, Broadhead called the federal government's response "highly inadequate" and a "tragic example of governmental insensitivity."

He said when the PBB "crisis" threatened to poison hundreds of thousands of Michigan residents, HEW's response was to refer the problem to a committee. Four months later, when that committee proposed strong recommendations, the department failed to implement the most important of them, Broadhead charged.

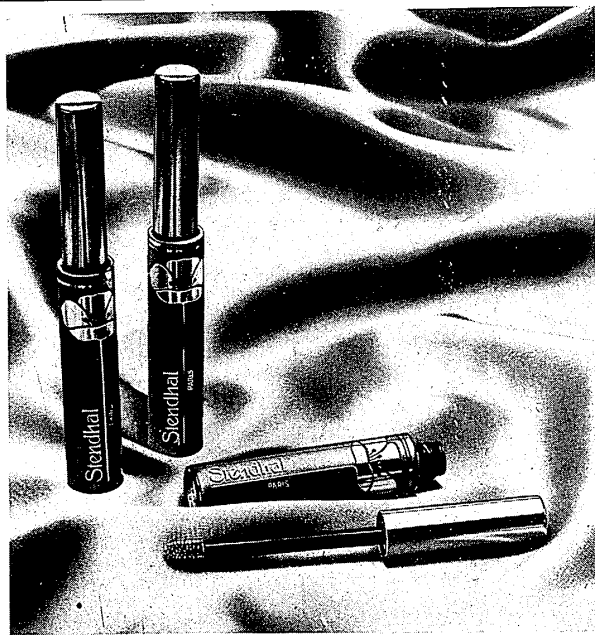
To control a similar poisoning outbreak in the future, he called for the creation of a special "chemical emergency response team" to "control and correct chemical contamination incidents quickly."

He also urged the Environmental Protection Agency to make immediate studies to determine if PBB contamination is a problem in other parts of the country and asked that agency to establish strict regulations controlling use of the chemical.

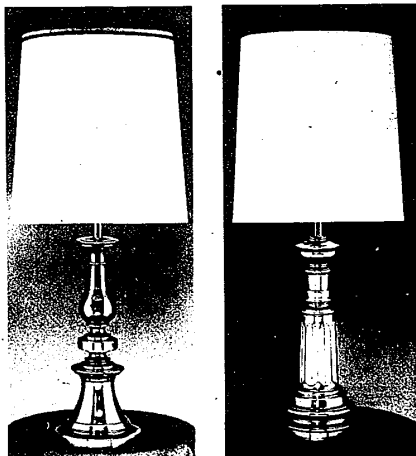
