Southfield City Councilman John Marcosky has proposed an ordinance prohibiting commercial signs in single family residential areas. The measure will be referred to the

The measure will be referred to the city attorney, planner and planning commission for immediate study and recommendation to council.

"I am proposing that no billboard, sign or poster advertising a commercial enterprise, and therefore doing business in a single family residential zone, be allowed because it would be in violation of Southfield's zoning ordinance," Marcrosky said. "This would be an amendment to the city's current single family residential ordinance which only refers to prohibition of signs pertaining to the

sale, lease or use of a lot or building. That provision was struck down by the recent Supreme Court decision lifting the ban on 'For Sale' signs: 'According to Black's Law Dictionary, Marcosky said, a billboard is defined as an crection annexed to the land in the nature of a fence for the purpose of posting advertising bills and posters.

"Bilboards come within the purview of deeds forbidding the use of a lot for business purposes," Marcosky said. "The word 'sign list defined in the law dictionary. That's why I think we have a better chance specifically prohibiting billoards such as those advertising real estate firms selling properties or construction and swimming pool companies doing business in single family residential sub-

divisions."

In the Supreme Court decision which overturned the ban on "For Sale" signs, Justice Marshall said, "If the ordinance is to be sustained, it must be on the basis of the township's interest in regulating the content of the communication, and not on any interest in regulating the form.

"Accordingly, we do not decide, whether a ban on signs or a limitation on the number of signs could survive constitutional scrulny, if it were urrelated to the suppression of free expression."

sion." For the purpose of amending the Southfield ordinance, Marcosky suggested, billboards, signs and posters would be defined as permanent or temporary structures, visible to the public and used to promote or display

advertisements, names, logos, in-signias, announcements or illustra-

EXCLUDED FROM the prohibition would be official notices, "no solicitors" signs, operation identification and "helping hand" insignias and other devices necessary for the health, safety and welfare of residents, Marcosky said.
"I'm not suggesting an all out ban on signs such as Oak Park is attempting in order to get around the decision of the Supreme Court." Marcosky said.
