



## **Ummm! Barbecued ribs**

Crisp ribs crackling over an open flame, and the pungent smell of a tangy barbecue sauce drifting through the air: The Plymouth Jaycees have done their part. Now it's up to you to enjoy.

All you need is a hearty appetite and a ticket to the club's annual rib dinner.

Not only is the traditional Saturday night feast a hallmark of the Fall Festival, but it's the biggest project of the year for the Jaycees and Jaycettes.

Although the planning and preparation begins months in advance, the real work starts on Friday evening. That's when everybody gets together at a member's home and starts putting together the cardboard dinner boxes.

The boxes arrive flat and have to be folded into shape. Then a napkin, salt and pepper, and eating utensils are put into each one. Vans take the completed dinner kits to the serving area next to the Penn Theatre on Penniman Avenue.

At 7 a.m. Saturday, the men start building the fire pits, and by 3:30 p.m. the fire is ready for the meat.

THE SERVING LINE is open at 5 p.m. And the Jaycees keep those ribs rolling until the last customer is served or until they run out.

Last year, the club served 3,000 dinners to Fall Festival goers, and they're planning to cook even more this year—at least 3,500, according to president Jim Picard.

Tickets are priced at \$3.50 each. But senior citizens qualify for a 50 cent discount. They can be purchased at the Jaycee booth on the day of the roast.

Besides the piping hot ribs, the meal includes hot buttered corn on the cob. cole slaw, bread and butter, a beverage and ice cream for dessert.

So bring your appetite. The Jaycees will be waiting.
