## Museum opens with rare art series

Reflecting Imperial Tsarist Russian traditions, Edith J. Freeman and internationally-acclaimed pianist Joann Freeman will perform an evening of Melodeclamation as the first offering of the concert series at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

Sponsored by the Founders Society, the performance will take place in the musuem's intimate 400-seat Recital Hall at 8:30 p.m. on Friday. Sept. 16.

Rarely included in most artists' re-pertoire, Melodeclamation, the dra-matic recitation of classic literature with musical emphasis, demands the jumest in balance and coordination be-tween the orator and the musician. Melodeclamation was the forerunner of the melodramas popular in Victo-rien times
