Few responded to school census

A state mandated school census in Southfield has proved to be a limited success in predicting future enrollments in the school district.

Last April, school officials sent out letters to more than 25,000 residents living in Southfield and Lathrup Village. The cards asked residents to list the number of school age and special education children living in the household. Cost of the census was \$4,500.

Answers to the census were supposed to be sent to the school district by June 1, but cards have continued to trickle in through late August. So far, less than 5,000 of the 25,000 census cards have been returned.

Richard Cadarette, director of pupil services for the school district, says that despite the limited returns the census has proved useful.

With the census, Cadarette said, a number of new students were identified, contacted by school officials and informed of registration procedures.

Several special education students also were located and contacted, he said.

The remaining cards will be translated into computer information and used to make projections of future elementary, junior high, middle and high school enrollments, Cadarette said.

A TRIAL enrollment projection, based on the returned census cards, was developed for one elementary school, Cadarette said, and was found to be close to earlier projections made by school officials.

But because replies to the census varied among school areas, he said, "comparisons may not be as valid" in some school enrollment areas.

Still, the computer projections may help to spot enrollment upswings and declines in some areas, he said.

The school census was mandated under a 1976 state law to ensure that the compulsory school attendance laws are enforced and to secure information regarding special education students under the age of 26 living in the school districts.

The census is to be taken every other year.

Parks & Rec sets classes

Southfield's Department of Parks and Recreation is offering a wide variety of classes for fall and winter.

Registration for Ice Skating Lessons only will be from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Civic Center Arena or Beech Woods Recreation Center. Students should register at the location where the particular class is scheduled.

On Sept. 8 registration for all other recreation programs is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Parks and Recreation Building. Registration must be in person and residents may register for members of their immediate family only.

Resident cards are required at registration and checks should be made payable to Southfield Parks and Recreation. Refunds can be given only before the second class begins. A service fee of \$2 is applicable on all refunds.

Registration will continue through the first day of class but residents are encouraged to register before Sept. 12. Non-residents may register beginning Sept. 12 at an additional fee of \$3 per class. The department reserves the right to cancel classes due to insufficient registration or causes beyond its control.

New offerings include backgammon, cross country skiing, figure skating school, houseplant care, racquetball, read and rap, and wills and estate planning.

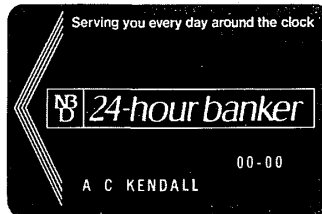
