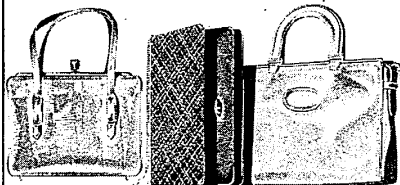
Associate editors of

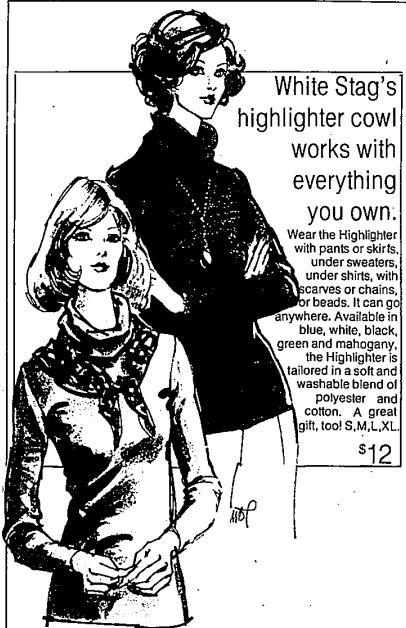
