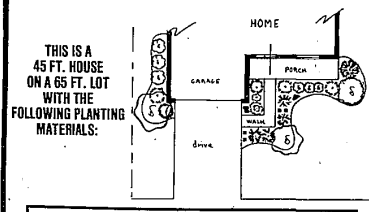

Falcom runners take 8th

Farmington High's cross country team, which will be seeking its fourth straight Inter Lakes League championship this fall, got its season off to a good start with an eighth-place finish in the AA Division of the West Bloomfield Invitational last Saturday at Marshall Metropark.

Coach Gerald Young's Farmington team scored 237 team points. Grand Blanc topped the AA entries with 49 points and Grosse Pointe North was second with 73. Jackson High took third place with 91 points. Warren Tower followed with 143.

Farmington senior Hugh Leidlein finished 15th in the individual race with a time of 15:48, and classmate Harold Rutla finished 32nd in 16:12. Mike White of Jackson High finished first in 14:59.

"I don't think we ran as well as we could have, but it was a very tough field with good teams from all over the state," Young said. "Considering the teams in our area, I think only Pontiac Central finished above us."

Farmington Harrison and North Farmington both ran in the A Division for smaller schools. Harrison finished 12th with 288 points, and North Farmington finished in a 14th-place tie with Birmingham Brother Rice with 334.

Portage Northern won the A Division team title. Brighton High and Northville High followed with 122 and 149 points respectively.

North's Paul Welch, a junior, took eighth place in the A Division individual race with a time of 15:49. Teammate Rich Stumpf landed 68th in 17:02. Harrison's best time came from senior Charlie Rogers, who finished 28th in 16:10. Harrison's Mike Foley, a senior, was 53th in 16:40.

The three Farmington high schools have dual meets on Thursday (Sept. 15) at 4 p.m. Farmington runs Pontiac Northern, and North Farmington runs Redford Union with both meets set for Oakland Community College. Harrison travels to Southfield-Lathrup.
