## Bankers blast Lance money dealings

Metropolitan Detroit-area bankers unanimously deny—some of them vehemently—that Bert Lance used "standard" financial procedures in operations of the Calhoun National Bank in Georgia.

C. Boyd Stockmeyer, chairman of the board of Detroitbank Corporation, which owns Detroit Bank and

Trust Company, said, "I don't know from what I read about (Lance) if he could pass an accounting test."

"If he were employed here and resorted to any one of about six practices he's alleged doing, well, for one or two of them he might get a first warning, but generally speaking he'd be fired on the spot," Stockmeyer said.

Stockmeyer, who said Lance's de-

fense of his actions before a Senate committee Thursday "didn't really mean very much," added, "When Mr. Lance says this is a common practice that every bank follows, if I was a depositor, I'd get scared."

Stockmeyer said Lance "isn't capable" of advising President Carter: Lance is the Carter administration's budget director.

Lance is accused of a number of banking irregularities, chief among them his self-admitted overdrafts from his personal accounts at the Calhoun National Bank of some \$400,000 while he was president and major stockholder of the bank.

HE ALSO HAS been accused of using the same 1457 shares of bank stock as collateral on two separate loans from two different banks. Lance is alleged to have used an airplane owned by the Calhoun bank and the National Bank of Georgia for personal reasons. That charge is under investigation by the justice department.

Referring directly to the overdrafts, a spokesman for the National Bank of Detroit said, "That is a very big no-no around here. As a matter of fact, an

officer of this bank who overdraws his account gets a stern warning and his supervisor gets one, too, and it says, 'this won't happen again, will it?'"

The spokesman said Lance's defense of the allegation—that he had sufficient funds in other accounts at the Calhoun bank to cover most of the overdrafts, and repaid the rest with interest—would be a matter for consideration for a large bank depositor who was not a bank officer, "but no way, for a bank officer."

Bernard Lund, a vice-president of Manufacturer's Bank, said, "I do support the fact that, one, he needed his day in court. (However) I do not think that any banker in the world, and I'm sure Mr. Lance would agree with this, should use his position with the bank for personal gain."

Overdrafts, Lund said, "are not common. Bank officers just do not overdraw their accounts."

Stockmeyer, chairman of Detroit Bank and Trust, said, "We're dealing with about 15 parts of the public's money for every one part of our own, and we operate on trust. I don't think (Lance) understands that."
