Stella Hartrick, one of the metropolitan area's oldest active bowlers who is now in her 83rd year, will be honored by the Michigan Amateur Sports Hall of Fame at its semi-annual convocation Nov. 15 in Athens Hall.

Winner of seven state and city titles while bowling with Clara Allen's famed Olympic team in the 1930s and 1940s, she was named "Star of Yesterday" by the Women's International Bowling Congress last year and was inducted into the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame in 1960.

Along with her many other honors, Stella shared the national doubles title with Clara in 1932 and they have teamed together every year since in the WIBC event.

CORA FIEBIG, the former bowling queen, is showing the male all-stars while bowling with Clara Allen's famed Olympic team in the 1930s and 1940s, she was named "Star of Yesterday" by the Women's International Bowling Congress last year and was inducted into the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame in 1960.

A member of the Bonanza team that dared to break the barrier in the men's circuit, she is topping the pins for a 215 average going into the third week of competition.

Penny Behn, captain of Cora's team, also is above the double century mark with 201.

ONE OF THE ODDITIES of the early season was furnished last week when John Soma, bowling in fourth position on his team, crossed lanes with Fred La Pointe at Woodland Lanes and each bowled an all spare game.

John, with a 175 average, posted a 182 and Fred, with a 187 average, fired a 180.

Another bowler who took over some of the spotlight was Janice Tanomina. Though she carries only a 143 average, she came through with a 235.

THE LITTLE CAESARS' league at Westland Bowl had its first 700 series when Jerry Cole Jr. linked games of 244, 212 and 245 for 701 to set the pace. Next to him came Jimmy Deck with a 248 in 639.

The girls in the league also did some

fancy shooting. Patty Rizzo was the leader with a 230 in 667. Jan Dimmer hit double century figures with a 220 in 697. Other high scorers included Julie Zimmerman with a 587, Elaine Kent with 586, Marge Kropacek with 582 and Phyllis Brown with a 230 in 545.

SHARON BEHRENDT, who won the city marathon bowling title last year, got away to a good start in the all-star league at Super Bowl. She fired a 639 to lead the field.

WHEN IT COMES to oddities, save a place for Carol Paliszewski. Bowling at Mayflower Lanes, she converted the 47-9-10 split on the way to a 575 series that included games of 210, 181 and 182.

ROSEMARY PRUETER, the Plymouth all-star who was dropped by the Bonanza team in the Bowlerettes League at the end of last season, got a measure of revenge Monday night. Facing her former mates, she rolled a

245 game to take high single for the evening.

Meanwhile, Mary Mohasi started the week well with a 604 to pace the league and Cora Fiebig's Luxury Lanes team was high with 576.

THE SENIOR CITIZENS had a field day at Garden Lanes when Merle Wright put together games of 233, 205 and 199 for a 637 while Bill Geddes was next in line with 545 and Al Crawford, the 81-year-old, posted a 516.

AT FARMINGTON LANES, Neil Beckman showed the way in the mixed classic with a 238 in 638 and Kim Harrington, a graduate of the teen classic, had a 155 in 573. In the ladies classic, Judy Laird had the leading role with a 586.

BUZZ RAY added his name to the list of those who have bowled all spare games when he did it at Plaza Bowl on the way to a 185.

ROBERT MC GUIRE had a good

time in the Good Timers division of the senior citizens loop at Plymouth Bowl. He posted a 231 in 531 and Anita Strach, bowling with the Early Birds, showed the way to her group with a 221 in 493.

LOIS MERRIMAN took top honors in the Livonia Ladies Classic with a 537-11-518 after being tied with Dorothy Goryca in the third game. Lois bowled 175-37-212 and Dorothy 185-23-212.

In the other games, Ethel Meisner won the first with 194-39-234 and Madeline Donahu took the second with 194-39-233.

LILLIAN DUGIT narrowly missed being the whole show in the Wednesday ladies handicap league. She won single games of 214-45-239, 194-45-239 and the series with a 540-135-645. The only game she missed went to Trudy Silek who posted a 183-43-225.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING OAKLAND COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION 1978 BUDGET and 1978 ROAD CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

The Oakland County Road Commission hereby gives notice of a Public Hearing at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 19, 1977 at the Oakland County Commissioners' Auditorium, 1200 North Telegraph Road, Pontiac, Michigan 48033.

The purpose of the hearing is to present the Oakland County Road Commission's proposed 1978 Budget, including the Oakland County Road Commission's proposed 1978 Primary and Local Road Construction Program and the funding thereof, and to provide an opportunity to all interested citizens and elected officials of Oakland County to present comments thereon prior to adoption by the Board of County Road Commissioners.

The proposed Budget sets forth the anticipated revenues available to the Oakland County Road Commission and that show the use of which these funds will be put, including the Operating Expenditures of the Road Commission and the Road Construction Program.
