The "White and Bright" book holds excellent non-color patterns for any room, basically white with mylar. They all mix well with traditional or contemporary furnishings.

Eclectic is the way to think when shopping for all home furnishings today, a pinch or a dash of contemporary mixed well with a large amount of traditional is the smartest design fashion outlook in interiors.

If you are into wall graphies, take a look at "Avante's Space Program" which is a collection of geometric graphic murals for home or office. It is only sensational. For a look of uncompromised elegance, you can have "Van Luit" and its many collections of significant importance where good taste abounds. Last but not least, other handprint selections from "Scalamandre" and "Brunschwig & Fils" both have companion fabrics and are in a class by themselves.




