CLORIDA A. BEAUCHAMP

Mrs. Clorida A. Beauchamp, 84, of 21528 Negaunee, Southfield, died Sept. 3 in the Southfield Rehabilitation Center. Services were held Sept. 6 in Heene-Sundquist Funeral Home with Fr. James Wright officiating. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Mrs. Beauchamp was a 50-year resident of Southfield and a member of St. Alexander's Catholic Church of Farmington. She is survived by her children Ernest and Madeline Beauchamp, Mrs. Germaine Auger, P. Roger and Rhea Bergeron; 12 grandchildren; and 24 great-grandchildren. As of the oldest of 13, Mrs. Beauchamp is also survived by seven brothers and sisters residing in Canada.

ALBERT A. SCHAEER

Albert A. Schaeer, 90, of Farmington died Sept. 15 in his home. Services were held at Heene-Sundquist Funeral Home and burial was in Udel Cemetery in Ypsilanti.

Born in a log cabin along the River Raisin in Monroe, Mr. Schaeer was the son of a German immigrant and his Swiss wife. He was founder and honorary chairman of the Motor City Paper Tube Company of Detroit and a charter member of the Composite Can and Tube Association of the U.S.

An authority on steam engines, he was a lifetime member of the Steam Engine Society. His steamboat the MAR-LIN, a World War I coal engine Mr. Schaeer himself converted to oil, plied the Detroit River during the mid 1890's and early 1970's.

Also a student of American Indian history, Mr. Schaeer specialized in research on the Sioux and Crow tribes. His many trips to the southwest reservations enabled him to collect Indian tribal chief headaddresses and costumes which he donated to the Monroe Museum.

Surviving are his two sons, Albert E. and A. Gilbert; two sisters; two brothers; and seven grandchildren.

MARGARET J. RIORDAN

Mrs. Margaret J. Riordan, 61, of Farmington died Sept. 17 in Botsford Hospital. Services were held at Our Lady of Sorrows Church and prayers were said at Heene-Sundquist Funeral Home. Burial was in Mount Olivet Cemetery in Detroit.

Born in New York and a longtime Farmington resident, Mrs. Riordan served in the U.S. Army as a medical and surgical nurse during World War II. She was stationed for several

months in Africa and the 24th General Hospital in Italy for one year. Service in other hospitals as well earned Mrs. Riordan the European Theater Ribbon with three battle stars, the World War II Victory medal and the Meritorious Service Unit plaque. She was also a nurse at Israel Zion Hospital and at Green Pointe Hospital in New York.

Surviving are her husband John J.; sons Kevin M. and John K.; sister Mrs. Berol Goldman; and brothers James and Anthony Miller. Mrs. Riordan was preceded in death by her son Christopher G.
