Dr. Kenneth Pelletier, author of "Mind as Healer, Mind as Slave," will be the featured guest speaker at the opening lecture for the Psychological Studies annual series, beginning at 9:30 a.m. Sept. 28.

The lecture is sponsored by Psychological Studies and Consultation Program, Inc., and will be held in Mercy Center, at Eleven Mile and Middlebelt. The organization, based at 6785 Telegraph, Birmingham, arranges the lecture series primarily for clergy and those in the helping professions, though all other interested church members are welcome.

The group provides seminar in psychology and mental health related to the clergypersons' counseling and educational tasks with individuals and families, the lecture series, plus counseling and psychotherapy.
