East Junior teacher turns to helicopter beat

Colleen Burcar-Gallerani just might be able to help you out of a jam—if you're on the road during rush hour and if you're listening to CKLW radio. Ms. Burcar is the new voice of Traffice Central, a service offered to commuters by the Windsor-based AM station for traffic-tied motorists. A Southfield resident and former Farmington teacher. Colleen Burcar (the name she uses on the air) recently replaced Jo-Jo Shutty-Mac-Gregor, who had been reporting traffic conditions on CKLW for the past three years.

Now a weather reporter for Channel 2 in Southfield, Jo-Jo did many of her traffic reports from a helicopter. To the surprise of many, Ms. Burcar has been broadcasting from CKLW's Southfield office on Labser Rd, and there are no immediate plans for her to go up in a copter for her broadcasts. "The station directors are sitting back and taking a look at the programming situation," she said. "They're weighing the advantages and disadvantages of using the traffic copter.

Ms. Burcar receives most of her information from a monitor system, much like a Citizen Bandradio. She hears virtually every call that comes through the state police. Additional information is received from the American Automobile Associated the American Automobile Associated the American Automobile Associated the Marchad Marchad Callerian She has a form in front of her listing all the main thoroughfares such as 1-41, 1-268, the John Lodge, the Southfield Freeway and the Jefferies. As

each bit of information comes in for a particular road, she jots it down on the form. From that information she puts together her 30-second broadcasts.

She is on the air six times in the morning between 5:20 and 8:50 a.m. (every half hour), and three times in the afternoon between 4:20 and 5:20 p.m. But if a major traffic hazard arises between broadcasts, she said, she can break in to notify travelers. "I can go longer than 30 seconds on the air if necessary, up to about a minute," she said. "But I I'ry not to because it cuts into the news time." Ms. Burcar said she hopes to help the morning and afternoon drivers


"My husband represents security to my children. When he's not home, they want to know where is he? What time will he be back?"
