

Citizen of the Year dinner scheduled

The 15th Annual Meeting and Awards Dinner of the Farmington Chamber of Commerce is scheduled for 6:30 p.m., Oct. 5 at the Botsford Inn in Farmington Hills.

The "Citizen of the Year" will be announced at the dinner to which chamber members and their guests are invited. The Citizen of the Year committee, headed by Pete Priolo, narrowed down the nominees to three candidates which were submitted to the chamber board this week. The board will select the winner at the dinner meeting.

Special speaker at the dinner will be James Barrett, president and chief executive officer of the Michigan State Chamber of Commerce. He is the youngest person to ever serve as a chief executive officer of a state chamber of commerce.

Approximately 4,400 business firms are represented in the state chamber, and Barrett has served in various capacities at the state level, including manager of education services, assistant to the president and vice-president.

A native of Lansing, Barrett received his BA degree from Michigan State University with a major in Financial Administration and is completing work at MSU for his master's degree.

Prior to joining the state chamber staff he was a clerk at Oldsmobile Division of General Motors Corporation; an auditor for the Municipal Finance Commission, Michigan Department of Treasury; and later a

His organization affiliations include past president and member of the Board of Directors of the National Council on Alcoholism, Lansing regional area; member of the State Railroad Advisory Council; and chairperson for business and finance during Michigan Energy Week.

Currently Barrett serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the Michigan Chamber of Commerce Executives; treasurer of MICH BUS PAC, a statewide business political action committee; treasurer of the Michigan Citizens Committee to Take the Courts Out of Partisan Politics; member of the Statewide Economic Education Council; and member of the Capitol Club.

Habit workshop scheduled at Mercy

Dr. Gregory Nunn, co-author of "Habit Control in a Day," will conduct a workshop Oct. 10 at the Mercy Conference Center, 2600 Eleven Mile in Farmington Hills.

Physicians, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, therapists, school special services employees, speech therapists, and others who wish to apply habit control techniques in their own clinics or school settings are invited to attend.

The workshop will include an overview of the literature; theoretical rationale for habit control techniques; and an outline of treatment programs. The afternoon session will offer audiovisual presentations, role playing techniques and practices and video tapes. Sluttering, bed-wetting, nail-biting, thumb-sucking, nervous tics, and other

anxiety related disorders will be examined.

Research with more than 1,000 persons have shown the average reduction was 90 per cent after the first week and 99 per cent after the first month using the habit control techniques, Nunn says.

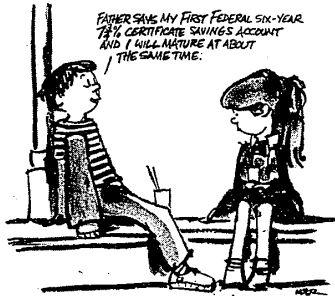
Dr. Nunn's book was co-authored with Dr. Nathan Azrin of "Toilet Training in a Day" fame.

"Habit Control in a Day" is scheduled this week by Simon and Schuster.

Dr. Nunn directs the Chicago Habits Clinic and is special consultant to the Illinois State Department of Mental Health and Disabilities.
