OU tops Calvin, 4-0

OU soccer squad relies on freshmen

Oakland University's young soccer team showed some potential over the weekend by defeating a highly regarded crew from Calvin College, 4-0.

The Pioneers, participants in last year's National Collegiate Athletic Association's Division II playoffs, were expected to falter since they lost 12 players. However, the team also blanketed Olivet in the season's opening game and has looked good in its first two outings. Head coach John Motzer remains cautious, however, when evaluating his troops. "Olivet is only in its

third year of varsity competition and did not really test our team," he said. "We are going to have to really improve if we are going to have a successful season."

Oakland will rely upon nine freshman recruits to continue the soccer success that the university enjoyed last season. Most were highly talented high school players, but are yet untested on the college level.

Among the most promising freshmen are Tony Hermiz from Ferndale High School, Troy's Simon Little who graduated from Birmingham Seaholm, Karim Hammoul of Birmingham Groves and Boldan Hreczynj of Hamtramck Immaculate Conception.

Hermiz has been pegged as the possible replacement for Ken Whiteside, who holds the career goal-scoring record of 81 goals at Oakland. Hermiz led all scorers in the North Suburban League last fall, was named the league's most valuable player and was selected for the Michigan High School all-star squad.

Little was named most valuable player at Seaholm, and Hammoul earned a reputation as one of the best ball handlers and most aggressive players in the Birmingham area while playing at Groves.

Hreczynj was an all-around athlete at Immaculate Conception, earning all-state honors in basketball and was named all-conference in football.

Other freshmen who have paced the offense in the early going this year have been Stanley Wandoloski of Washington Eisenhower and Andrew Lock of Birmingham Groves. Lock

scored twice against Calvin and is tied with Hermiz as the team's leading goal scorers so far this season with three goals.

Helping bolster the inexperienced squad will be returnee Robert Bukari of Center Line High School, Mark Christensen, a sophomore from Madison Heights, Madison, Tony Matye, a sophomore from Warren Cousino, Joe Wilden and Ken Kasper of Eisenhower and Roman Bej, a sophomore from Immaculate Conception.

A pair of seniors returning to the team which made the midwest regional semifinal playoff game in St. Louis last year include captain Gerhard Weber from Center Line High School and Ouma Jr. from Kenya. Another senior is 57, 130-pound defenseman Bill Harries of Auburn Heights.

Other promising freshmen include Gary Beck from Livonia Stevenson, Peter Dzielak of Oak Park, Robert Read from Birmingham Groves.

Miguel Serratos Jr. of Detroit, and Michael Weber of Eisenhower. OU's soccer team will be home Saturday afternoon starting at 1:30 p.m. for a match against Central Michigan University. On Oct. 5 the Pioneers will be the guests of the University of Toledo.

Motzer is in his ninth year as the Oakland University soccer coach. Andris Richter, a 1977 graduate who earned All-American honors at Oakland University, is an assistant coach.

Smooth Winterberry (Michigan Holly)
 Grows to 9; wide spreading plant; yellow fall color with bright red berries through winter, good plant for most soil, our size 2.29

Lynwood Gold Forsythia
 Grows from 6-8; upright, semi-erect habit; deep yellow flowers in early Spring; good non-invasive screen plant, our size 3-6

Arrowwood Viburnum
 Grows from 6 to 12; white flower clusters in early June; blue berries and red leaves in fall; fast growing and tolerates most soil, our size 3.95

Peking Cotoneaster
 Grows from 6 to 8; upright spreading; blue berries and red fall color, our size 4-5

Amur Maple Shrub
 Grows to 15; dense branching; good as hedge screen; bright orange red color, our size 2.29

Autumn Olive
 Grows from 8 to 10; very dense with green-shine foliage; specimen hedge or windbreak; white berries in fall, our size 3-4

Viburnum Lantana (Wayfaring Tree)
 Grows from 10 to 12; upright erect habit; white flowers; clusters in May; red berries in fall, our size 3-6

Regal Privet
 Grows from 6 to 8; very dense, graceful horizontal branching; fast growing informal hedge, our size 2-3
