Both women have children in junior high and grade school. They arrange their shifts at the helm of the business so each can spend time with her family.

Their section of the back room boasts straw elves and Santa mugs as well as a large stained glass window. "I'm having so much fun," said Mrs. Hammond. "I see people here that I haven't seen in four or five years."

Since the shop began as an alterna tive to passing the winter months or school and subdivision committees the duo charge 25 per cent commission on each item in contrast to some other shops that charge up to 45 per cent.


