Role of family physician returns to prominence

For many years, the family physician has considered himself largely as
a triage officer, who identified problems of ill health and channeled them
to various specialists in order to
resolve them. The generalist or family
physician tended to play a less significant role in patient care while the
patient was hospitalized, while a battery of specialists and subspecialists
managed the patient. In more recent
times, and particularly in 1977, the
family physician is playing a more sig-

nificant role in patient care in the hos-pital.

For one thing, family practice has become a clinical department in the hospitals. There is a clearly defined delineation of hospital privileges for each physician, generalist and special-ist.

ALSO, a residency training program in family practice has been established in many hospitals (including Botsford General Hospital) and the family physician then qualifies as a certified specialist in general practice. In the family practice residency, the

physician is exposed to an in-depth training in the various clinical depart-ments, such as surgery, internal medi-cine, obstetrics, and pediatrics, along with training in the supportive serv-ices, such as X-ray, pathology. At the present time, a physician qualifies for this residency in family practice after he has served an internship in an approved hospital.

The hospitals are becoming far more active in community affairs, particularly where the activities are health related. Among these activities are:

1.The training of qualified people in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Dem-

onstrations are offered to community residents.

2-Pre-natal programs for expectant parents are offered on an organized level with physiciars and nurses participating in these programs.

3. Classes for patients with diabetes and the families of diabetic patients are offered on an organized base of the patients of the

5.Nutrition and dictary classes for patients with special problems requiring special diet programs, such as beart and high blood pressure problems.

6.Career programs for high school, as well as elementary school students.

7.Pharmacy interns from Ferris State College.

8.Residency in hospital adminis-

8.Residency in hospital administration. (Xavier University in Cincin-

nati.)

9.Medical technicians and medical records students receive clinical training at the hospital (Schoolcraft College.)

10 Guests lecturers for various community organizations are available.

11 Emergency medical technicians receive didactic and clinical training. There are, of course, ongoing in service training programs for hospital personnel in every area of hospital personnel in every for the providing these services. With the expanded role of the family physician and the effective utilization of review committees as to length of

patient stay, there has been a considerable reduction in patient stay at the hospital.

THE ESTABLISHMENT of a professional building and an outpatient surgery, an outpatient x-ray and nuclear medicine service contiguous with the hospital has helped to minimize cost of patient care and make professional services more readily available to natients.
