Room for Design



Designers can save dollars

If you want to save money decorating, you can't afford to make mistakes. The expertise of an interior designer can avoid those mistakes and save you time and money.

To decide which designer is right for you, you must know three things: what services he or she can offer, how much it will cost, and most important, his or her credentials. As a general rule, the use of an interior designer is a luxury because he will use the finest craftsmen and the best quality merchandise available. But the experience and knowledge of the professional can be translated in dollars and cents advantages that you will profit by.

WITH HIS EFFICIENT measuring, planning, shopping, ordering, and supervision of installations, he will take all of the bothersome details off of your mind.

In addition, the designer's knowledge of the market enables him to go straight to the correct source, thereby eliminating wasted hours. Some of these sources may sell only to designers. This is generally the case with showrooms.

The important considerations in selecting a designer are as follows:

- Reputation: Is the designer fair, honest, and reliable? Will he or she get the job done as promised?
- Fee: The range in charges is wide and there are several different methods of payment. Some charge according to amount of money spent, while others charge a percentage or a flat fee. You should investigate this and have a thorough understanding before you begin.
- Personality: Your designer is only as good as your rapport with him or her. Find one who will work well and

easily with you. Before hiring a designer conduct an in-depth interview. Ask to see a home the designer has done or ask for references or photographs. Your personalities should be compatible.

SOME DESIGNERS are consultants. They will charge you a flat fee or hourly rate to advise you about doing your own decorating. This works well if you know what you like and where to get it and only need some color coordination or room scales.

Many times the services of a designer consultant are required when you are moving or building a new home. You will find the consultation of a designer most helpful when deciding on furniture arrangements and color schemes, or when choosing tiles, formicas, wallcovering, carpets or flooring.

It is important to stick with the same designer, for then and only then can you follow through with one plan from beginning to end. If you change designers in mid-stream, you may end up out of tune with what you originally visualized for your home.

A graduate of Harrison High School, she has toured the United States and Canada as lecturer-clinician with University of Michigan's Professor Louis Stout in a program featuring a collection of more than 40 French horns. The program has been filmed for educational television viewing.

The French hornist has performed with the Plymouth and Flint Symphony Orchestras. In 1977 she played for six months with the Orquesta Sinfonica de Nicaragua while teaching in Nicaragua National Conservatory.

She is an honorary member of the Detroit Waldhorn Society and has performed, as a member, for the International Horn Society.

Ms. Tomchak has given private horn instruction since 1970.

McKELVEY graduated from Farmington High School and is now in his senior year at University of Michigan. In February he will be presented by U-M's School of Music in his degree recital.

McKelvey performed in 1975 and 1977 with the Philadelphia Orchestra under conductor Eugene Ormandy. He is a member of U-M's Wind Ensemble and has recorded with that group.

For the Musicale he will perform compositions for trombone by Defay and Leopold Mozart. His accompanist will be Musicale president and pianist Sue McCallum.

Chairman for the day will be Mrs. Melvin Walck, and her tea chairman will be Mrs. Archie Mallette.

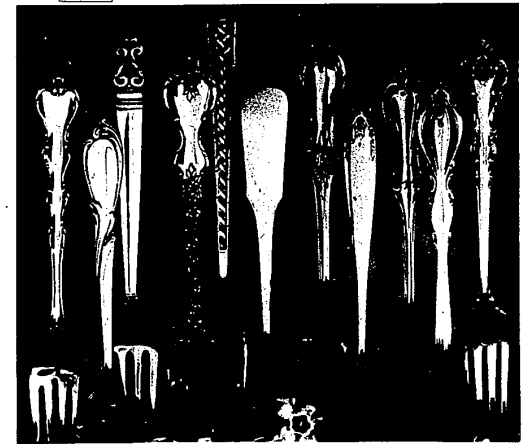

Ms. Rose is a junior.

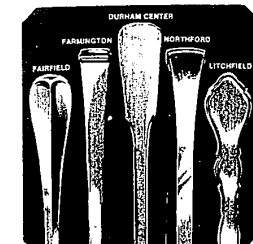

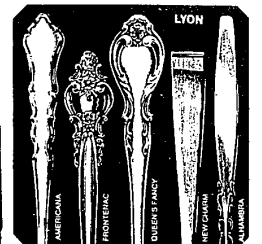
