IN SOME instances the program helps the aides to use skills which otherwise would stagnate in retirement. Some volunteers for the tax assistance program were employed in real estate offices or had their own accounting service, said to Nylin.

Volunteers are selected based on their ability to fill out the income tax

Additional training is provided by a three-day IRS session and through study of the Michigan Income Tax form and the Homestead Tax Credit-Rebate. After training AARP volun-teers are included in the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program

program on Feb. 3. The sessions end March 23 in Merry Center.

Sessions are scheduled in the morning and afterneous, only. "ATTHIS year, Its aldes will be trained by the Internal Bevenue Service (IRS) to assist seniors who find it difficult to complete their tax forms or need advice, according to Iver Nylin, of Farmington Hills, program coordinator for the area. He expects the program will belp more than 500 persons this year. a tax form is easier than most persons believe.
"People don't read the instructions," he said. "There's nothing that difficult about it. Most people could get through the forms if they read the ristructions and realized what changes had been made. The IRS eliy ou what changes it has made during the year."

SOME, individuals can compute their taxes, but have difficulty filling in the forms. These persons, such as the handicapped who are unable to to press hard on the pencil or to write, are helped by the volunteers who go over the light writing. Persons are asked to bring their "W" forms, 1098 report for dividends and interest, to know the amount of intrest they earned in 1977 as well as their social security number. Real estate tax receipts are important if the taxpeer is itemizing his return or using the Homestead Tye Credit-Rebate. The tax allows residents to get a credit on their state

income tax or a rebate for household expenses which exceed 3.5 per cent of their taxable and non-taxable income. For persons under 65-years-old, the rebate-credit would amount to 60 per cent of the expenses. For those over 65-years-old, the state would rebate all of the excess expenses.

When applying for the rebate-credit, taxpayers should know the amount of rent they've paid in the past year. The name and address of their landlord also is necessary, said Nylin.

AARP VOLUNTEERS will not be able to help on some filings because of the time it takes to complete them. Said Nyin.

Stock transactions, five years averaging of income or other complicated forms will be referred to the IRS office's help.

"Normally, the types of returns we prepare aren't that intricate. Intricate questions are referred to the IRS." he said.
