New course for nurses offered by Madonna

Registered nurses employed in emergency room care, are among those who will receive special training in delivery of primary emergency service through a grant awarded to the emergency medical technology department at Madonna College in Livonia. Under the expanded program, funded by a grant of \$38,337 from the federal HEW department's division of medicine, 60 advance medical technicians, 40 in-service registered nurses, and 10 pre-service registered nurses will enroll in a new curriculum within the 1978 school year.

The three-course program consists of Emergency Nursing-Basic, Emergency Nursing-Advanced-1, and Emergency Nursing-Advanced-2, a total of 12 hours.

Classroom lectures, clinical experience, group discussion, laboratory demonstration and observation, and

experience in ambulance service will be used throughout the program. Films, tapes, and other auto-tutorial equipment will be available in the college's health instruction center. Sites for clinical experiences will include Providence Hospital, the Detroit Emergency Medical Service, several local fire departments and private ambulance companies.

COMPLETION of the program will allow toward a two-year associate, or four-year baccalaureate degree in health care.

Registration is held daily from 8:30 a.m. to 4:40 p.m. in the college's Student Service Center at 36600 Schoolcraft, at Levon.
