A list of definitions is meant to be an "appetite whetter" as is the bibliography which includes some favorite books to explore in the world of interior design. You will find most or all of them in your bookstores or libraries. Most are definitive, descriptive and illustrated.

MOSAIC—A surface decoration in which small chips of ceramic tile, marble, or stone are set into mortar.

REPRODUCTION—A copy of a fab-ric, rug, wallpaper, furniture, or any item that was designed in an earlier time. An exact copy in every detail is usually referred to as an authenit reproduction. If there is deviation in a copy, it is gnererally referred to as an adaptation. HOBNAIL GLASS—A type of milk glass molded into decorative ware, the outer surface is studded with an all-over pattern of small domed bumps.

DIRECTOR'S CHAIR—The now leg-endary movie director's lightweight, folding armchair, canvas sling back TUXEDO-A tailored sofa style. The back is sometimes given a slight back-ward pitch, arms and back are of the

same height, fully upholstered or framed in wood.

JAPANNED FINISH—A black lac-quer or enamel finish developed in an attempt to duplicate Oriental lacquers. A long-lasting glossy finish is built up in layers to give a bas-relief, sculp-tured effect.

PAISLEY—A timeless pattern use on fabric, wallpaper, carpets, origi-nated in Paisley, Scotland as the fringed wool shawl worm in the mid-1800's. Swirling abstract leaf multi-colored patterns are traceable to ancient persian design.

TABOURET—Small round uphol-stered stool or bench introduced dur-ing the first quarter of 18th century. Name is French for stool.

FILIGREE—Openwork patterns in metal, wood, twisted gold or silver wire. Filigree galleries edge period style occasional table.

LIBRARY STEPS—Movable steps with a handrail on one side, upright or

spiral in design, used to reach topmost bookshelves in high ceilinged rooms.


