**OU women  
use big rally  
to top Wayne**

Down by 10 points with less than  
four minutes left, the Oakland Univer-  
sity women's basketball team rallied  
for a 69-67 victory over Wayne State  
University last weekend.The Pioneers, now 3-0 in the Great  
Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Confer-  
ence (GLIAC), put on a full court  
press to stage their dramatic come-  
back against the Tartars. Wayne (3-0)  
steadily built its 10-point lead in the  
second half after leading at the inter-  
mission, 36-33."We underrated Wayne and were  
looking forward to Grand Valley,"  
said Oakland coach Rose Swidzinski,  
whose team played Grand Valley in a  
key GLIAC match Monday evening.  
Against the Tartars, Oakland was  
led by sophomore Helen Shereda's 21  
and freshman K.D. Hart's 20 points.  
Wayne's leading scorer was Ruth Fra-  
ser who had 22.Shooting a dismal 30 per cent from  
the field (25-80), the Pioneers stole the  
win at the free-throw line, making 17-  
23 to the opponents' 9-20.  
Swidzinski's Pioneers, 5-1 overall,  
including a recent victory against Mid-  
American Conference (MAC) foe East-  
ern Michigan University, will host  
Saginaw Valley Saturday (5 p.m.) at  
the Athletic Building, and Ferris  
State Monday (4 p.m.).**MEN'S BASKETBALL**  
It was a rough night for the Pioneers'  
men's team as it lost to the  
highly regarded University of Detroit  
Titans, 95-58. The game was actually  
an improvement for the Pioneers as  
coach Jim Mitchell's squad held the  
Titans to less than 100 points for the

first time in three tries.

John Long scored 12-16 shots from  
the field, and two free throws for 26  
points, and Terry Tyler, the multi-tal-  
ented center, scored 13 points and  
grabbed 14 rebounds. Terry Deurod  
contributed to the triumph with 23  
points, and substitute Dave Niles had  
12.The Dick Vitale-less Titans also beat  
the Pioneers in the following cate-  
gories: Free throws made, rebounds,  
assists, blocked shots and steals.  
The Pioneers had the majority in  
personal fouls and turnovers.Last Saturday, the Pioneers erased  
a 10-point halftime lead in the second  
half against Wayne State, but were  
edged by the Tartars, 57-55.The GLIAC loss lowered the Pioneers'  
record to 1-1 (conference) and  
4-12 overall.Guard Bill Scott topped OU with 14  
points, while Craig Harts and Derek  
Knight each had 10 points.A thorn in OU's comeback attempt  
was Tartar guard Nate Mack who  
missed just three of 13 shots from the  
field.**MEN'S WRESTLING**In last week's wrestling action, OU  
fell to Lake Superior, 24-9. The Pioneer  
winners were Phil Liebiang (11-6  
record at 121 pounds), Mike Eble (7-2  
at 137), and Andy Whitfield (5-1 at 170.)Max Hasse's Pioneer wrestlers face  
Grand Valley and Northern Michigan  
this weekend.**Schoolcraft to host  
volleyball tourney**Area high school volleyball squads  
will take a break from regular season  
competition this weekend and compete  
in the fourth annual Schoolcraft Col-  
lege Invitational Volleyball Tourna-  
ment.Thirty-five teams will be involved in  
the tourney, including 14 Observer &  
Ecceitior-area squads. The com-  
petition will be keen, as last year's  
winner, Flint Holy Rosary, will defend  
its title against such teams as Fer-  
ndale, last year's runner-up,  
Bloomfield Hills Andover and Dear-  
born Edsel Ford.All four Livonia schools will partici-  
pate—Bentley, Stevenson, Franklin  
and Churchill. Redford Thurston, Red-  
ford Union, Westland John Glenn,  
Livonia, Clarendonville and both  
Garden City schools—East and West—  
will round out the area competitors.Plymouth will be represented by  
Salem and Canton, while all of the  
Farmington schools—Harrison, North  
Farmington, and Farmington will add  
their squads to the tournament.The tournament will start at 9 a.m.  
Saturday and will run until completion  
late the same night. The 35 teams will  
be divided into seven pools of five  
teams and will compete in round-robin  
play until 3:30 p.m. when the playoffs  
will start.The winners of each pool and five  
second-place teams will make up the  
playoff competition.Admission is \$1 for adults and 50  
cents for all students. The charge will  
cover all competition during the tour-
