

Courage is contagious

One of the most wonderful and important human values is courage. There are people all around us who give us examples of courage. They enrich our lives.

A person faces a difficult illness or surgery, another struggles through a divorce, another through trying circumstances in their work. These persons face the reality of their situation and are free to talk about it and find resources to face the threat with integrity and hope. They have courage.

WHAT DO WE SEE in those who are courageous? First, a belief that with other's support and God's help they can overcome their difficulties.

People of courage are never alone. They reach out and accept support. They know that this is necessary and a sign of strength to ask. Courageous people draw from the resources that are available, both human and religious.

Those who have courage, second never doubt that joy, hope and a sense of life are impossible. A man long ago faced his own death wrote: "Everything works for good with those who love God and seek to do his will."

People of courage grasp something of this truth. They do not use words such as "never" or "impossible." They believe that all circumstances can be transformed into the possible.

Third, we find that people of courage show their emotions. They recognize the importance of their many human

needs and feelings. Unfeeling courage has no benefit for us. It is not human nor can others relate to unfeeling persons.

If I can be a human being with feelings and needs and still have courage, that is a great thing!

FINALLY, the courage of another person gives us strength. Persons of courage have learned from others. They heard about it and observed it when they were growing up.

They read stories of courageous men and women and identified with their struggles. As adults they are still seeking to grow in understanding and an expression of courage.

Courageous persons leave us a legacy which we also have the opportunity to pass on. It is a quality of life which we need to pay attention to and enhance in our own lives.
