Canton never fell behind after this second-half spree but received a bit of a scare in the final quarter as the Hawks were determined to peck away at the margin.

Harrison closed the gap to seven points, 56-49, after three quarters but saw the Chiefs build the lead back to 12 points, 57-55, with 4:31 left in the game.
