License law miffs local businessmen

In an attempt to smooth the ruffled feathers of the Farmington Hills busi-ness community, city officials are making some concessions regarding the recently adopted business licensing

making some concessions regarding bet recently adopted business licensing ordinance.

In response to the charge that the licensing was hastily thrust upon area businesses, the Jan. I deadline for applications was extended to Jan. 31. Meanwhile a study session for the city council concerning the controversial licensing ordinance has been scheduled for Jan. 30, during which business owners will have the opportunity to voice their objections to the ordinance.

The timing of the ordinance and the annual renewal fee are the business community's major concerns. Farmington Chamber of Commerce president Ed Lane recently suggested. The Hills city council adopted the ordinance Nov. 28, under a resolution that supplanted the council's desire to expend the supplementation of the second property was the supplementation of the second property was the supplementation of the summer of an annual business personal property was the supplementation of the summer of an annual business license.

The desire to have a master list of all businesses in the community is another intention of the ordinance, City Mgr. Gorge Majoros indicated. Business owders failed to receive a letter of notification until mid-December, according to Lane, which gave them a scant amount of time to meet the original Jan. 1 deadline.

Although Lane says the community understands the concept of the initial application fee, most businesspersons are opposed to the annual renewal fee, be says. Initial application fees average about \$30, while renewals typically are \$25 per year.

pleased pleased in the penalties for failing to meet cadlines, Lane Said. A penalty fee of 25 per cent if added to the fee schedule for applications received 15 days after the due date (now Jan. 31), while a 50 per cent penalty fee will be added to applications received thereafter.

WHILE city officials are attempting to enlist the business community's cooperation, they have agreed to forfain from ticketing the Fun Factory, a pinball arcade, whose manager is legally challenging the constitionality of the ordinance. Although the ordinance closely follows other business liceraing ordinances in the state, including the City of Farmington's ordinance, Atty. Robinsons will fail to stand up constitutionally in court.

"What we are saying is that the statute is unconstitutional in that it denies
equal protection under the law, and
it's a deprivation of property without
due process," Frederick said last
month.

Because the ordinance does not have similar restrictions for bowling alleys, pool halls and other establishments patronized by teenagers. Frederick believes the pinball arcade's restrictions under the ordinance will not stand up in court.

A Jan. 11 hearing in Oakland County Greuit Court wan postponed, and the city has agreed not to ticket the arcade in the meantime, according to City Atty. Paul Bibeau.
