Court House netters fall

When Court House Tennis & Racquets Club first entered the Metro Tennis League competition in 1975 its players learned a lesson right away.

"That was before the players realized that this league is blood and guts," said Court House manager Mike Mehas.

Court House teams learned their lesson well. Ever since that meet two years ago they won all their matches, including two league championships.

Oak Park Racquet Club's team, which has placed third each of the three years the Metro Tennis League has existed, ended the Court House string Saturday.

The 215-183 victory vaulted Oak Park into first place in the league standings with 1,163 team points after five matches. Court House is close behind with 1,114 points.

The rest of the Metro Tennis League standings are: 3. Square Lake Racquet Club 997; 4. Rochester Hills Racquet Club 842; 5. Franklin Racquet Club 766; 6. Centaur Racquet Club (four matches played) 760; 7. Farmington Racquet Club (four matches played) 687.

OAK PARK dominated the men's play in winning the victory over Court House. Oak Park men won 10 of 12 matches, while each team won six of the women's matches.

"They loaded up their men's lineup," Mehas said. "We had a couple illnesses and no shows. They were just too tough. We'll get them in our rematch in April."

Two Metro Tennis League matches are scheduled for each of the coming Saturdays. Centaur travels to Farmington and Court House plays at Franklin, 8 p.m., Jan. 28. Oak Park plays an away meet against Rochester Hills, while Farmington travels to Franklin, 8 p.m., Feb. 4.
