Plymouth Man Cycles With 'Wandering Wheels'

A seminary-bound Plymouth youth is on a six-week bicycle trip from Miami to Seattle as part of group of 40 young men known as the "Wandering Wheels."

Bill Cummins, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Cummins, and his companions are traveling about 120 miles a day conducting gospel meetings of song and testimony in the evenings. The group, which includes two motorcycles and a truck that carries the cyclists' gear, expects to reach Seattle by July 4.

To Rebuild Dormitory

A men's dormitory at a college in Chile, destroyed by a disastrous earthquake, will be rebuilt soon as a result of funds to be given by members of the Farmington Seventh-day Adventist Church, 29831 Ten Mile, at services on Saturday, June 28.

Since the earthquake, says Elie Stola, 35023 Sheridan, Sabbath school director of the local church, students at the school have had to live in temporary quarters.

Funds given at services in the local church on Saturday, added to those being contributed by more than 3,000 Adventist congregations throughout North America at the same time, will help build a new dormitory for the school—the Chile Seventh-day Adventist College located at Chillan in south Chile.

A portion of funds received at the special 18th Sabbath offering will also be used to build a new auditorium at the Adventists' Northeast Brazil College, a girls' dormitory at the Espirito Santo Academy at Calatine, Brazil, explains Stola.

"These building projects to which the Farmington Adventist Church will contribute on June 28 will greatly aid these three schools," notes Stola.

"Increased numbers of students desiring a Christian education make it imperative that these projects be underwritten. Students and parents in these economically depressed lands must be helped if proper education is provided."
