**Kochipillo Art Gallery**—Recent wood sculpture by Richard Tucker will be on display through Feb. 25. Tucker is a local Michigan artist. 

Sara Lynn Hickey of Southfield has been named to the dean's honor roll at Emporia State University for the fall semester. It was announced recently.

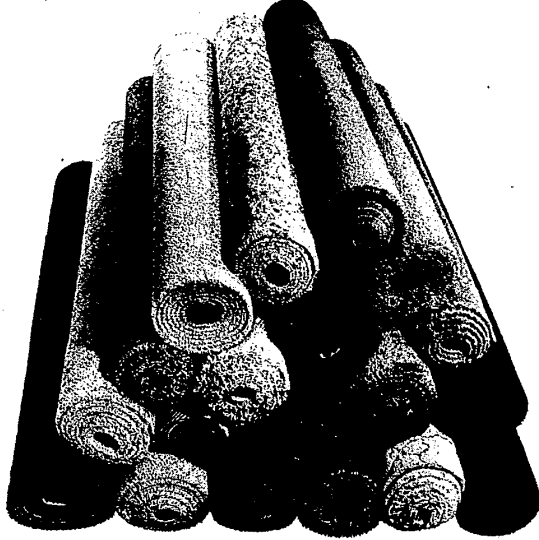
In all 429 Emporia State students were named to one of the two honor rolls, with 118 on the president's list and 311 on the dean's list. Students
