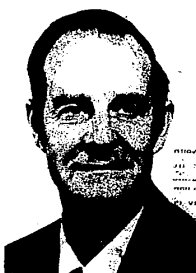

Congregation honors priest

The men's club of Congregation Shaarey Zedek of Southfield will honor Msgr. Clement Kern at a brotherhood Sabbath service and luncheon on Saturday.

Sabbath services will begin in the main sanctuary of the synagogue at 10 a.m. The brotherhood sermon will be delivered at 11 a.m. and luncheon will follow services at 12:30 p.m. There is a charge for the luncheon.

Msgr. Kern is being honored in recognition of his ministry to the community, his lifelong concern for the welfare of his fellow man, and his inspiring witness to the power of the humanitarian spirit.

Ordained a priest in 1933, he served at St. Leo and St. Edward Catholic churches before being assigned to

Most Holy Trinity Church in 1943.

Msgr. Kern exercised leadership in the changing community surrounding his church, and mobilized efforts to alleviate the burdens and brighten the lives of the poor, the deprived and the disenfranchised. His efforts have been directed towards the welfare of the labor movement, urban renewal, the United Farm Workers, fair housing and the Latino community.

The minister has expressed consistent identification with the redemption of the Jewish people in the land of Israel and has shown deep concern for the plight of Soviet Jewry.

Msgr. Kern has received an award from the Labor Zionist Movement, and was granted a distinctive tribute by the Histadrut. Israel's labor organiza-

tion.

The Detroit Round Table and other interfaith causes have been the recipients of his guidance and wisdom. His friends and admirers are to be numbered among the diverse religious, racial and social groups within the metropolitan area.

Retired from the active ministry, Msgr. Kern is a pastor-in-residence at St. John Seminary and continues to support the high ideals which are intrinsic to his character.
