OU women cagers win 3 games

Oakland University's women's basketball, men's swimming and men's wrestling teams had successful outings last week as their respective seasons entered the final stages.

Rambling past Delta, Spring Arbor and Lake Superior, the women's basketball team climbed to 11-2 overall, 6-1 in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC).

Their latest victory was a romp of Lake Superior, 93-54. Freshman K. D. Harte netted 26 points, while sophomore forward Helen Shivers, who has been scoring at a rapid pace in the last few weeks, grabbed 28 rebounds and added 20 points.

The Pioneers fell to Western Michigan 31-15 in another match. Ken Masters (1:54) and Marvin McGlellen (2:42) were the OU winners.

Oakland was scheduled to host both Windsor and Adrian last Friday, but only Adrian made it into Rochester. Since five of Adrian's ten wrestlers were ill, Oakland had a rather simple 406 victory.

This Saturday the Oakland wrestlers will compete on the road against Dayton and Northern Kentucky.

OU'S MEN'S SWIMMERS not only darted past Central Michigan University Friday, but set four NCAA II national qualifying times. Corey Van Fleet's crew won 68-45 at Tom Boyd took first in the 200-IM (1:59.1) and 200-fly (1:59.83).

Other national qualifiers were Tom Allen (2:13.8 in the 200-yard breaststroke), B. J. Kenny (2:07.75 in the one-meter dive) and the 400 medley-relay team of Mark Doyle, Allen, Scott Teeters and McIntosh which clocked in at 3:39.0.

In a 61-52 victory over Kent State a few days later—which upped the men's mark to 4-2 for the season—the 400 medley-relay team established an

NCAA II number-one time. The quartet of Allen, Doyle, Teeters and McIntosh went the distance in 3:38.4.

Also aiding the Pioneers' cause in that win were victories by McIntosh (2:27.7 in the 50-free) and Boyd (2:08.2 in the 200-IM).

AFTER RECORDING a pleasing 30-point victory over Ferris State two weeks ago, Oakland's men's basketball team has faltered twice—at Northwood and Lake Superior.

Tim Kramer, who had a college-high 38 points against the Bulldogs, con-

nected on only three-of-14 floor attempts as the Pioneers bowed to Northwood, 56-55. With 15 points, senior forward Ellis Stephens was coach Jim Mitchell's leading scorer.

8 on Saturday, Mitchell's second-year mark fell to 5-16 when Lake Superior played past the Pioneers 65-64. Assistant varsity coach Lee Fredricks noted that illnesses to starters Bill Scott, Kramer and Stephens forced OU to play springily, and caused an all-freshmen lineup in the second half.

Oakland must win four of its last seven games to match last season's 9-19 overall mark.

Southfield spikers win

Southfield High defeated Ferndale High, 15-8, 15-11, last Monday to move into a first-place tie with Royal Oak Kimball and Ferndale in the Southwestern Michigan Association volleyball standings.

Southfield has a 3-2 overall record and a 2-2 mark in the SMA.

Leo Oshinsky, Southfield's first-year coach, praised the play of Leslie Fink, Janet Malkasian and Karen Shulman in the win over Ferndale. "Their blocks really saved the game for us,"

he said.

"Our team is really inexperienced, but we're getting better game by game," Oshinsky said. "We have a lot of good individuals, and they're starting to play together now."

Southfield plays next at home on Thursday against Kimball. The SMA contest begins at 7 p.m. Southfield-Lathrup's volleyball team plays next on Feb. 13 at Troy Athens. The Metro-Suburban Association game starts at 7 p.m.



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
