Farmington man arrested in Troy drug bust

Troy police arrested three men last week confiscating 3.500 pounds of marijuana with an estimated street value of \$8 million in what police called the largest drug bust in the history of the city.

Arraigned Saturday on charges of possession of a controlled substance tmarijuana1 with the intent to deliver, were: Thomas Merceurio, 22, of Detroit; Michael Butler, 29, of Parmiglion; and Gilbert Baker, 31, of Union Lake. Baker was also charged with possession of a felority, which carries a mandiatory two-year sentence.

Mercurio and Butler were released on \$10,000 personal surety bond, while Baker posted \$10,000 cash bond. Pre-liminary examinations for the three were set for Feb. 24 at 8:30 a.m. in Troy Municipal Court.

Rochester just south of Square Lake across the street from the Silven Glen golf course.

Cpl. Ewald Rollinger said the bouse was rented out by its owners. Parnount Homes of Michigan, to an tenant unknown to police at this time. When police locate the owner, Rollinger said there is a possibility that further arrests will be made.

According to Rollinger, the investigation began at 9:30 p.m. Thursday, when a suspicious person report was made to Troy police by a neighbor, who believed somebody was in the bonne which had only recently been built.

Mercurio did not give the officers what they felt were adequate responses to their questions relating to his presence in the home. Upon checking the residence

they found the marijuana."
Rollinger said the marijuana reported to be high grade Columbian gold, was in 74 fourty-eight pound bugs. He said Mercurio was arrested, and the house was put under surveitance by Troy, Madison Hieghis and Oakland County police.
Rollinger said "At p.m. Friday two men later identified as Baker and batter showed up at the residence. For

some reason, probably becausee Mercurio wasn't home, they had a dissussion outside the house and pulled a van that Butler was driving into the garage. A few minutes later Butler came out and was arrested with a quantity of marijuana in the van. About 30 minutes minutes later. Baker left the house in a car and was arrested.

After the arrests were made, Rollinger said police took the marijuana to the Troy police station.

"I don't know where it came from." he said. "We can assume it came from a larger source. but we can assume almost anything right now. There is a possibility that there will be further






