Art in church

A tradition goes on

St. Andrew Catholic Church is continuing an ancient tradition of churches housing religious works of art. On exhibit inside the modern church in Rochester is a 48-inch bronze sculpture, "A Nun Meditating," by Lloyd Radell. Radell is a professor of art and chairman of Mercy College of Detroit's art department.

Radell's sculpture was selected for exhibit, according to the Rev. Joseph Mahoney, St. Andrew pastor, because his style of art reflects the 20th century design of the church.

"There is a shortage of religious artists," said Fr. Mahoney. "Most religious artists produce art that is from the 13th to 15th century. The artists put that style into the wood sculptures. Gothic sculpture doesn't fit at St. Andrew with its high, sweeping ceilings."

Mahoney said the parish is considering purchasing statues of Mary and Joseph and is displaying Radell's statue to show what modern religious art can look like.

"We want to see how the congregation responds to Radell's work," he said. The sculptor, who lives in Oakland Township, is comfortable with religious themes.

"I work at a Catholic institution run by the Sisters of Mercy. I modeled the sculpture off a nun at the college," Radell said.

Common to Radell's style, he initially modeled the work in clay to give it a

loose surface and then he cast the piece in bronze.

"A Nun Meditating" will be on exhibit at St. Andrew Catholic Church, 1234 Ingleswood, for an indefinite period, according to Radell, who taught at Oakland University for five years.

Radell's work, which he describes as figurative sculpture, has won him national recognition in many contests and commissions.

First prize winner in the 1974 National Sculpture Society Competition, one of his sculptures is housed inside Maple Hill Mall shopping center in Kalamazoo. The "Awakening" is a 500-pound bronze of a woman waking up and beginning to sit up in bed.

Radell, from Troy, created the Bailar Medalion for his alma mater, Wayne

State University, and he also was one of 10 sculptors invited to compete for a Michigan Blue-Cross Blue-Shield commission.

He's been commissioned to do busts, such as the one completed two years ago of Woodbridge N. Ferris, a former Michigan governor. U.S. senator and founder of Ferris State College.

"I work in the humanist tradition," Radell said. "I prefer doing portraits in nature for my own satisfaction and also, for commissions."

He's exhibited in many places throughout Michigan, including Oakland University, Rubiner Gallery, Temple Israel, Pontiac Black Cultural Exhibition, and Michigan State Fair, and has had his works displayed in exhibits in Ohio, New York City and Ontario.

Antique series scheduled

A series of lectures on antiques will begin Wednesday at the Detroit Historical Museum.

Sponsored by the Detroit Historical Society Guild, the series will be from 7:30 p.m. p.m. Wednesdays, Feb. 1 through March 15. The speaker is J. Jordan Humberstone, senior vice president of the Heritage Antique and Appraisal Society.

Humberstone's topics will include discussions on metal, tin, brass, and silver; blown, pressed, and cut glass; pottery; furniture of the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries; and antiques as tomorrow's investments.

'Australian to lead series

Alan Walker, Australian evangelist, will lead nightly services Saturday through Thursday, Feb. 18-22, in the Metropolitan United Methodist Church of Detroit under sponsorship of all Methodist denominations in the metropolitan area.

The program, titled "New World Mission," will include not only the preaching of Dr. Walker, newly appointed director of evangelism of the World Methodist Council, but also nightly appearances by Found Free, a youth gospel rock group from Philadelphia.

Saturday's lead-off events will be a press conference with Dr. Walker, an opportunity for him to meet with choir,

ushers, steering committee, counselors and others working on the mission and an 8 p.m. concert by the gospel-rock group.

The week of mission will involve worship at 7:30 p.m. each evening, morning seminars from 10 a.m. to noon under the leadership of Dr. Walker and his wife, Winifred, an accredited lay preacher, and concerts by Found Free for 15 minutes before each evening worship.

Methodist denominations sponsoring the mission are United Methodist, A.M.E. Zion, C.M.E. Free Methodist and Wesleyan.

A native of Sydney, Dr. Walker is author of more than 20 books and has

conducted missions in several parts of the world. For seven years he headed a television program, "I Challenge the Minister," which had a viewing audience of half a million.

The World Methodist Council he represents is composed of 62 Methodist groups in work in 90 countries.

Found Free, a six-member band, has performed all over the United States and has made a 21-city tour of Australia. Recently, the group completed an album, "Transformation."
