Farmington wrestlers headed for finals

They'd better make room in the ath-letic trophy cases at Farmington High, North Farmington and Farmington

A total of 16 wrestlers from the three high schools are headed for the state Class A finals this weekend at Western

A total of 16 wrestlers from the three high schools are headed for the state Class A finals this weekend at Western Michigan University in Kalamazo — and some of them look like good bets to bring back weight class titles.

The 16 matmen qualified for state by finishing in the top four in their respective weight classess at the Class A Walled Lake Western regional tournament last Saturday.

Coach Barry Walsh's Farmington High team did the best, qualifying seven men and finishing second with 97 team points in the 22-school regional. North Farmington, with six qualifiers, finished fifth with 61 points, and Harrison leaf legional champions in .85-pound Ron Stern and heavy-weight Scott Mazen. Other Falcon qualifiers: Randy Stern (second at 119 pounds), Randy Allain (third at 126), Lou Miliani (third at 126), Lou Miliani (third at 126), Jeff Fagan (1964) and John Murphy (fourth at Ron Stern, who has a 233 individual Ron Stern, who has a 234 individual Ron St

at 165).

Ron Stern, who has a 33-3 individual record, won the 98-pound title with a 5-1 decision over Hazel Park's Tom Davids in the regional final. Hazen, a 255-pound junior, has a 32-5 record after taking a 6-2 decision from Red-ford Thurston's Matt Barbour in the heavoweight final.

"I think Ron Stern has the best shot at going all the way at state." Walsh said, "He's been at the state meet before, and lost. He wants it bad this time."

NORTH FARMINGTON'S best regional finish came from senior Mark Schulle, who firished second at 191 pounds. Brian Devis of Ferndate timed Schulle, now 28-6, in 4:56 of the finals.

"You get up there (at the state finals) and you never know what's going to happen," said North coach Jim O'Leary. "I think Petroft, Scheilte and Sudkamp have good chances to place in the state meet. A lot depends on who they'll face in the opening rounds."

Harrison came out the regional with two champions and a fourth. Kevin Suetterlin, who is 350 in 105-poural matches, won the title with 10 decision over Thurston's Brian Galdes. Fred Blackmer, now 342 at 178 pounds, won the title, pinning Ferndale's Chris Reeves in 3:66. Harrison's Rob Fawcett finished fourth at 191.

Harrison coach Dick Cook has high popes for both Suetterlin and Blackmer.

"I'd be very surprised if anybody beat Fred (Blackmer) at the state meet," Cook said, "He's got to be one of the strongest wrestlers in the state at that weight.

"And Kevin (Suetterlin) is a good leg wrestler. He also has good balance and good strength in his hands, which is important. He's a very cagey wrestler, probably one of the smartest I've ever had."

HAZEL PARK, a wrestling powerhouse from the Southeastern Michigan Association, won the Western regional, scoring 110% team points. Detroit Catholic Central finished third with 86 points, Thurston was fourth with 81½, and Ferndale was sixth with 56%.

The Class A finals begin at 11:30 p.m. on Friday at WMU. The competition continues on Saturday, beginning at 11 a.m. The consolation finals begin at 5 p.m. Saturday with the finals set to begin at 6:45 p.m.
