Company celebrates decade

From a single challenge 10 years ago Harriet Berg developed a dance company, the Festival Dancers, that has been delying tradition ever since. The challenge came when the Detroit Masical Society asked Ms. Berg, dance teacher at the Jewish Community in Oak Park, to chorcograph a dance to Leonard Berstein "Chichester Psalms."

She did and designed it for nine women and five children. It was given as a Curistmas program at the Wayne State University Community Arts Auditorium and at least 50 more times in the three

and at least 50 more times in the three years following.
That's how the Festival Dancers, sponsored by the Jewish Community Center, came into existence. And they have been an integral part of the metropolitan dance scene ever since.
There's hardly a suburban community or an intition where here he was or art institution where they haven't

To celebrate this decade of art, the Festival Dancers will give two performances March 20, 21 which will amount to a grand dance family

Many of the early dances will be performed once again and this is no small feat. Dances aren't the same as words, they can't be written down and recorded in detail for posterity. Movements are elusive—something less than exact science. Festival Dancers who generally range in age from 20-40, many of them housewives with children, are frequently women with dance backgrounds sæking an artistic outlet.

"What I love about the company," said Ms. Berg. "is that these women are products of Detroit dance studies. All are married, most have children and they have all of the things in their lives that every other housewile has—meals, car pools, ski trips with their husbands, shopping and cleaning, yet, having this commitment makes them get their work one faster."

THEY ALL ATTEND a minimum of two classes a week and, when there are performances coming up, there are additional rehearsals. They are always reworking techniques and while a contemporary dence company, work in a number of styles—jazz, ballet, ethnic, and modern.

In the past year the Festival Dancers toured with a performance of "Women's Rights."

"This," explained Ms. Berg, "explores voman's life from birth to death."
