Michigan voters can expect to see a Nov. 7 ballot proposal to prohibit the release of prisoners before they have served their minimum sentences. Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson said Wednesday he had more than the required 212.000 petition signatures to force a statewide vote.

Pattern styles.

Pattern opposes the so-called "good time" law, which allows prisoners to be released on parole before serving the entire minimum sentences. He argues that many violent crimes have been committed by paroled prisoners.

If the state legislature declines to act on a petition, the proposal can be put on the ballot.
