Love needs to reach out

Joining with family and friends to celebrate the 50th wedding anniversary of my parents offered me another opportunity to note and appreciate the outreach of care and nurture in a mid-western rural area.

Visiting with uncles and aunts—many of whom were not blood relatives—cousins, friends and neighbors, I was surprised by the number of those who maintain an active contact with their "heirs" of life and faith, as well as by their concern for well-being.

Cynics might regard this care and concern with suspicion, and well I remember the days of my youth when it was simply taken for granted that one's actions could eventually be reported to the home.

There is a potential abuse in the nurturing of life by an extended family unit, but as statistics for the number of "runaways" and "throwaways" con-

time to increase, the ability of the nuclear or immediate family to foster life and responsibility in urban society must be examined. Perhaps we are demanding from the nuclear or immediate family what it cannot possibly provide.

The isolation of contemporary life in urban America fosters a privation that is destructive of life. The turning

aside from the wounded and hurt on street and lane is not only legal, it is also non-threatening.

Neglect in attending to the life and hope of the young among us is not a status offense, only an offense. But the essence of community has been established nor exercised and thus will never be realized.

There is considerable risk in regarding the lives of others as ones for whom we should care. One cannot reach out to another without giving of oneself. But it is in giving that one also receives and the circle of life is made complete.

Love, encouragement, support, sharing et al are not limited to the immediate family. As they become part of that life that reaches out beyond itself they will not only lift and inspire the other person but also enrich and enhance the one who gives as well.

North Church now 75

It's only been in Southfield for 22 years but North Congregational Church is actually celebrating its 75th anniversary.

It was the spring of 1855 when the cornerstone was laid on a damp, chilly day in the middle of open fields.

Today, the church—located in the triangle between Lahser, Northwestern and Civic Center Drive—is surrounded by office buildings. But its carillon tower, a gift of former minister Chester Emerson, is still visible from the expressway.

North Woodward Congregational Church, as the congregation was known when it was at Woodward and Blaine in Detroit, was formed by the merging of two offshoots of First Congregational Church of Detroit. When dedicated in February 1911, it was the first church to be established beyond Grand Boulevard.

In time, members began to move to the suburbs and membership dwindled. The answer seemed to be for the church to follow its members' and finally it did.

North Congregational Church in Southfield now serves the people of 14 communities in northwest Detroit and suburbs. It provides daily activities for members and friends of the church, as well as community events.

North Church's choir is directed by Harry M. Langford and the religious education program is led by the Rev. David Howell. Its women's association is one of the few women's groups in the area to meet weekly. North Church Senior Men's Club attracts participants from a wide area for its Tuesday activities.

A dinner at noon on March 5 will mark the celebration of the 75th year of the church.
