



Students outline scientific acumen

Science was on the minds of many Farmington youngsters this winter, as more than 350 junior high age students prepared for recent science fairs at O.E. Dunkel and Warner Junior Highs.

Dunkel's 15th annual fair drew more than 250 exhibitors, and ninth-grader George Fomin made a repeat performance as overall winner.

Fomin's project, "Psychic Powers," displayed his work in Extra Sensory Perception, predictions and mind reading. Fomin also took first place in the ninth grade division, followed by Mike McKibben and Laura Gabel. Eighth grade winners were Julie Nedrow, John Ross, and Peter Goetz. Randi Ruskin, Dave Gundersen, and Chris Campbell took first, second, and third place prizes for seventh grade.

Miss Nedrow and Ross followed Fomin in balloting for the overall winners of the fair.

At Warner Junior High's second science fair, 98 students exhibited their work. Ninth grade winners were Erin Kelly, Eric Frick, and Liz Kavieff.

Susan Malinowski, Audrey Brennan, and Susan Pickett were the winners in the eighth grade.

Seventh grade winners were Kevin Haines, Laurie Levinson, and Tom Jablonski.

Instructor Dick Corp was coordinator for the Warner Science Fair, aided by teachers Jim Spencer, Tom Van Horn, and Doug Gooyer.

Dunkel teachers sponsoring the fair were Richard Jahn, Robert Winters,

Sections 35, 36 discuss grants

Another one-third will be paid by the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation.
