The board will be watching the legi-lature to see if it will act on the declin-ing enrollment problem. "If the state doesn't do anything to be poople for additional funds." If there is a millage vote, it would be part of the scheduled board election Jane 13. Currently is operating on a 7.9 mills levy. McDowell said if the board cuts spending, he had no idea in what direc-tion it would go. "When we got the three mills (extra) this year, we told the voters promise we intend to keep." He said Charenceville's problem is not unique. "Our declining enrollment but problem travina in a "declining enrollment districts. "The school districts need help from the saite legislature. We are hoping about it."

"We have made no attempts to resolve the problem as yet; this is just a preliminary approach. At the March 23 meeting, we will have to face the issue," he said.
