Groves spikers continue winning pace

TWO OF THE AREA'S top volleyball teams got together Thursday, and Birmingham Groves prevailed, 15-3, 15-12, over Bloomfield Hills Kingswood.

Groves improved its overall record to 12-1 while Kingswood fell to 9-2.

In the first game, Laurie Thorsen served seven straight points to lead Groves. The Falcons had eight kills and limited Kingswood to one spike.

Thorsen and Motria Ryzjy spiked well in the first game," said Groves coach Audrey Cox.

Groves' Krista Richey served seven straight points to pace the second game win.

Groves found itself down 11-5 before Richey came to the rescue.

The Falcons will entertain West Bloomfield Monday.
