

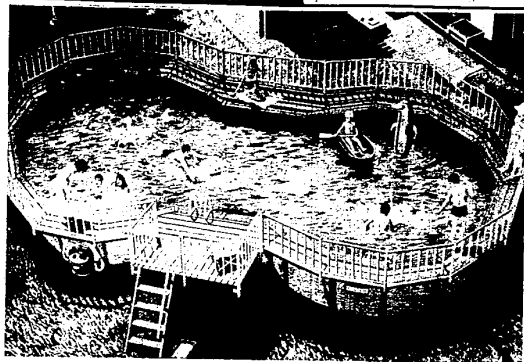

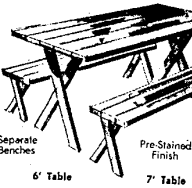

Fireworks Planned In 5 Communities

There won't be any necessity for Observer-land residents to travel any distance Friday evening to view the traditional July 4 fireworks. Those residing in Livonia, Farmington, Plymouth, Garden City and Redford won't have to buck much traffic to reach the scene of fireworks displays — unless they wait until the last minute to get to the site.

LIVONIA, AS USUAL, will have the biggest display in the annual fireworks program presented by the Detroit Race Course at its huge plant, Middlebelt and Schoolcraft Roads.

The DRC has entertained as many as 25,000 in the past and Executive Vice President and General Manager Paul Naylor expects the largest attendance to date Friday—provided the weather man co-operates.

The gates to the track and parking lot will open at 7 p.m. with Livonia police on hand to handle the traffic. The grandstand will be open and it will be a case of first come, first in the best seats.

The DRC has seating for more than 20,000 and parking facilities for that many cars.

The fireworks are slated to start at 9 p.m. and DRC officials believe this year's program will be the most spectacular ever presented at the track.

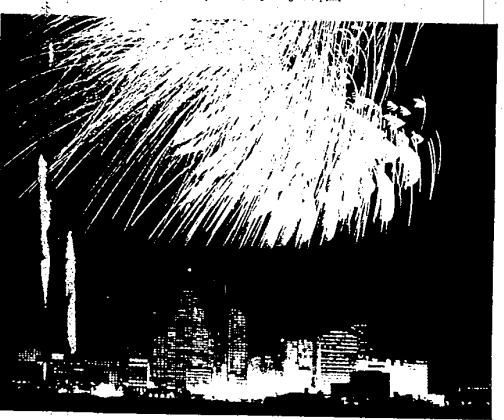
PLYMOUTH'S ANNUAL display, sponsored by the Jaycees and members of the business, financial and industrial community, will start at 9 p.m. on the Little League diamonds, east of the city on Plymouth Road.

Parking will be available in the Burroughs parking lot across the road.

Redford Township residents will get their annual fireworks display at Bell Creek Park, Inkster at Five Mile Road, where the Jaycees will sponsor the program. It is slated to begin at 9 p.m. with plenty of parking available in the park.

In Farmington, the activities will shift to Woodall School, Peppermill north of 12 Mile Road and west of Farmington Road, for the annual display sponsored by Kendallwood No. 1 and Colony Park.

Garden City's program will take place in the city park, Merriman and Cherry Hill, beginning at 9 p.m.
