The government has adopted a plan to facilitate and simplify the filling in of conscription registration cards June 5. Circulars containing, the twelve questions to be asked and advice as to how they should be answered have been prepared for distribution.

Registration Cards," reads as follows:
"Questions will be asked for you to
answer in the order in which they appear on this paper. These questions

"Do not write on, mark or otherwise
untilate these instructions. Do not femove them. They should be carefully
read go that you will have your answers ready when you go before the
registrar.

"All answers will be written on the registration, card in ink by the registrar, who should be careful to spell all names correctly and to write legbly.
