Seamless poured floors are becoming increasingly popular. This material comes as a liquid which is applied to the floor in several coats. The application of plastic coats after the last coat creates various patterns. Underlayment is generally required, but if the old floor is sound and smooth, you can usually do without it. Application is no problem, as it is painting a floor with a roller. Work out a good schedule so successive steps are carried out on time without disrupting the household.

The floor can be covered up the wall to eliminate baseboards, so cleaning is much easier.




