

Paris In City On Saturday The High Note Of Festival

Farmington City Hall will look something like Paris' Left Bank Saturday when it is taken over by the Farmington Artist Club. The Farmington Artist Club will hold its annual Founders Festival exhibit of works by artists from the Farmington area on Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Art works will be arranged out of doors on easels, peg boards and on the ground in authentic, casual French-like tradition.

The show usually attracts 20-25 local artists whose specialties range from oils, acrylics, collage, water color, and charcoal to tempera.

There will be no set pattern to the arrangement. The display will be on an individual basis with artists placing their displays where they think the works show to best advantage. All paintings will be for sale.

Founders Festival party will hit a high note at the festival conclusion on Saturday, July 26, starting at 9 p.m. when the Downtown Farmington Center will be filled with square dancers.

The city will clear an area 200-by-200 feet in the parking lot so dancers can sashay with style.
